  - ii. Brought up UCFs Autonomous Vehicle research project
- f. General Discussion
  - i. There was discussion about whether affiliate apartments near UCF require zero-tolerance background checks for staff and tenants? UCF will check with Housing.<sup>2</sup> Does UCF encourage, or will UCF look to adopt, a zero-tolerance policy for housing off campus (UCF affiliated, and maybe other)
